Scope of analysis (individual component) within the direction: "Protection of veterans' rights"

Purpose: Veterans, thanks to the skills acquired during service and positive reputation in society, are a strategic resource for the reconstruction, development of the economy and security of Ukraine.

1. State policy to protect the rights of veterans due to the large-scale military invasion of the Russian Federation into Ukraine must find answers to the following challenges:
 - a rapid increase in the number of veterans and families of fallen defenders who need social support and payments;
 - lack of financial resources to meet all identified needs of veterans, their families and family members of fallen defenders;
 - the impossibility of predicting the number of veterans who will be eligible for government support after the end of the war;
 - progression of the scale of necessary social support and targeted needs in veterans' affairs, in particular in urgent psychological and medical assistance, rehabilitation of military personnel, veterans, family members of fallen defenders;
 - detection of numerous violations during the mobilization procedure (superficial examination of documents, formal passing of military medical commissions), as well as the absence or poor quality of training of mobilized persons without military experience, which increases the risk of being injured or killed;
 - lack of effective tools for the transition from military to civilian life;
 - forming a request in society to update the definition of the concept of "veteran" and its corresponding criteria, including for the acquisition and realization of the right to social protection
 - the need to recognize the contribution of civilians in countering the modern threat (volunteers, rescuers, etc.), with distinction from the contribution of veterans
2. The demand for the modernization of the veterans' policy has never sounded as acute as during the period of active hostilities. The prerequisites for this are a certain set of political and social factors that demonstrate an insufficiently coordinated understanding of the essence of veteran policy, which is now, for the most part, focused on a remunerative, rather than a motivating, function.
3. The need for political coordination of the role of the Ministry of Veterans and the development of its institutional capacity remains relevant. Lack of coordination by the Ministry of Veterans of the scope and list of social services and social support to which veterans and veteran family members are entitled, in accordance with the system of assessing their individual needs, imperfect interaction between the veteran body and the bodies of the security and defense forces, which provide social and legal protection of citizens, regional development, complicates the formation of a new veteran policy and the introduction of a transition system from a military career to civilian life.
4. Among other things, it should be taken into account that many active military personnel who defend the country in the war with the Russian Federation have at the same time the status of a veteran (participant in hostilities or even a person with a disability), which causes the need to improve such interdepartmental interaction in order to provide them with social support with taking into account dual status. The problem is also that the Ministry of Veterans Affairs does not

have data on how many veterans continue military service. Using this inconsistency, there is political manipulation of the expectations of the veteran community by expanding declared social benefits, services, and preferences that are not financially supported.

5. There is an understanding that interaction with veterans based on the principle of equal and dignified treatment without emphasizing the vulnerability of this category of citizens will contribute to increasing both respect for veterans in society and their self-respect, as well as improving the veteran's active reintegration into peaceful life after completing military service.
6. Veterans, as a rule, are economically active people, members of civil society and leaders of public opinion who are able and aspire to be drivers of positive changes in the state. But veterans have different expectations regarding their state support, misunderstanding and, as a result, non-acceptance of changes in approaches to social support for veterans.
7. Therefore, when planning changes in the veteran policy, it is necessary to take into account that veterans have a heightened sense of dignity and justice, and the inability to independently integrate without professional support into the broad social, socio-economic life of the country, when veterans are more comfortable being among their "own", risks of possible radicalization may arise sentiments in the veteran community, which should be duly taken into account.
8. The system of state social support for veterans must be updated in accordance with the needs of today's veterans and unified for all persons entitled to veteran status. For this, it is necessary to carry out comprehensive research, analysis and forecasting of the needs of veterans, their families and the families of the deceased, which may also constantly change in connection with the social and political situation in the country. The current system of social support for veterans is not adapted to the need to motivate its recipients to find ways of self-sufficiency and gradually reduce veterans' dependence on state support.
9. In accordance with Article 17 of the Constitution of Ukraine, the state provides social protection for citizens of Ukraine who are serving in the Armed Forces of Ukraine and other military formations, as well as their family members. The Constitutional Court of Ukraine has repeatedly concluded that enhanced social protection of military personnel complies with the principles of equality and the rule of law, since military personnel "perform constitutionally significant functions; therefore, the state must grant them and their family members a special status and provide additional guarantees of social protection in accordance with the fifth part of Article 17 of the Constitution of Ukraine both during service and after it ends" (KSU decision of April 6, 2022 No. 1- p(II)/2022). That is, the state recognizes the obligation of enhanced social protection for both military personnel and veterans, and guarantees its implementation. This is primarily due to the significant risk to the life and health of military personnel who consciously perform their constitutional duty to protect the sovereignty of Ukraine, exposing themselves to danger.
10. The beneficiaries of the renewal of the foundations of the state veteran policy are not only veterans and their family members, family members of fallen defenders, but the entire Ukrainian society in general. The state veteran policy should be based on the principles of simplicity, clarity, barrier-freeness, respect for the veteran, expression of public gratitude for his contribution to the defense of Ukraine, provision of mechanisms and support for him to independently improve his well-being in civilian life after military service.

11. Reforming the veteran policy taking into account the standards and best experience of NATO member states, which most closely matches the conditions of Ukraine, in particular, the modernization of approaches to determining the legal status of veterans, their social support, the introduction of a system of transition from a military career to civilian life and the provision of services for their faster recovery and integration into the social and economic life of communities, will confirm the dignified attitude of the state to veterans. The transition from preferential life support for veterans to a system of motivation and self-realization in civilian life after the end of military service according to the experience and standards of NATO countries will ultimately have a positive impact on the development of civil society in general, strengthening the economic and entrepreneurial capacity of citizens.
