Draft Ukraine Recovery Plan

**Materials of the “Youth and Sports”
working group**

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INTRODUCTION

The main problems that are to be addressed under the Recovery Plan in the areas of youth policy, physical culture and sports, national and patriotic education

As a result of the war, 40% of young people in Ukraine have been affected: more than two million young people have become internally displaced persons and around two million young people have been forced to flee abroad.

Before the war, there were more than 300 youth centres and spaces operating in Ukraine. As of April 3, 2022, 93 youth centres have altered the format of their activities and are actively providing assistance to the civilian population, operating as humanitarian hubs, shelters for internally displaced persons, volunteer centres, and assistance centres for those who are in need. As of June 2022, 23 youth infrastructure facilities belonging to the youth centres and spaces have been damaged, completely destroyed or occupied, 59 - occupied.

68% of youth workers have been forced to leave their regions. To the question "Are you able to deliver your youth work?" 37.6% of respondents have answered that they are, 51% - are partly able to deliver it and 10.8% - fail to deliver it.

A great number of representatives of civil society institutions, youth councils, youth centres, youth workers and other youth policy stakeholders have lost the opportunity to work sustainably and harmoniously, and in many cases have changed their place of residence, and suspended or altered the format of their activities.

Young people are facing a lot of challenges, including anxiety disorders and mental instability experienced by young people, both those who have stayed in Ukraine and those who have gone abroad, low levels of independence and resilience, and disability to cope with the current situation. Moreover, the economic instability in the country, high unemployment and migration (internal and external) rates, destroyed youth infrastructure and the outflow of youth workers have a negative impact on the wellbeing of young people.

At the same time, one complex issue is in the spotlight: *the lack of a safe and favourable environment for living, working and realising the potential of young people in Ukraine.*

It includes the inability of young people to cope with the challenges they are facing as a result of Russia's war against Ukraine, low basic needs, anxiety disorders and low levels of independence and resilience. As a result, young people do not have the opportunity and desire to devote their time to the development of their territorial community, village or city, the country in general. It can also be considered as a result of the limited access of young people to services, including those provided by youth centres and youth workers under the war and in the post-war period, a weak system of support for youth living and returning to Ukraine, unsustainable (institutionalised)

youth communities, including civil society institutions, their networks, youth councils.

In 2021, 26 all-Ukrainian events of national and patriotic education were conducted, in which more than 300 000 people participated. Civil society institutions were provided with the financial support for the implementation of 34 projects of national and patriotic education with over 360,000 participants.

With the beginning of hostilities, the national and patriotic education projects were suspended and activists began to take an active part in volunteering.

According to a social survey, part of the population of Ukraine identifies with the citizens of the former USSR, namely 33.8% of citizens in the East and 34% - in the South. Only 55.9% of citizens in the South of Ukraine are proud of their citizenship. In addition to that, more young people aged between 14 and 34 have militaristic attitudes towards state defence in comparison with people aged between 35 and 65 and older (42.6% vs. 35.4%).

The insufficiently formed Ukrainian national and civic identity, defence consciousness and the integration of the population of the temporarily occupied territories in the post-war period present key pressing issues of national and patriotic education.

Moreover, the sphere of physical culture and sports was affected by Russia's military aggression with the participation of the Republic of Belarus, and it resulted in limited opportunities for Ukrainian citizens to engage in selected physical activities and sports, disrupted education and training processes aimed at preparation of athletes for the most important competitions.

As a result of Russia's large-scale military aggression against Ukraine, physical education classes, active breaks, physical culture activities, and operations of clubs and sections at educational institutions have been suspended. It is impossible to hold physical activities in places of mass recreation, residence and work and to implement the social project of the President "Active parks - locations of healthy Ukraine". Some physical culture and sports facilities situated in locations with intense hostilities have been damaged and destroyed.

In addition, in the field of physical culture and sports a serious problem is the dependence of physical culture and health activities, development of reserve sports and sports of higher achievements on the capacity of local government budgets, attitude to physical culture and sports by local leaders and deputies. Also out of consideration are the issues of establishing the priority of Olympic and Paralympic sports in determining the amount of logistics, salaries and rewards from the results achieved, measured by quantitative and qualitative indicators. The solution of these problems requires priority in the restoration of the sphere.

Since the beginning of the year, physical culture and sports communities have held only 427 events out of 1 076 planned, which involved about 19 000 workers engaged in various types of production activities; 936 out of 3 924 planned activities have been carried out by the centres of physical health of the population, in which 45 105 people participated.

As of February 24, 2022, more than 2 400 athletes in Olympic and non-Olympic sports and sports for people with disabilities were in almost 40 countries around the world, where they were partially given the opportunity to train and participate in international competitions; almost 3 000 athletes suspended the training process.

Athletes (especially the reserve ones) and coaches who have gone abroad have been provided with the proper conditions for training and work. There are cases when foreign clubs and teams offer long-term contracts to athletes and coaches, and young people graduating from general secondary education institutions get the opportunity to continue their studies. This situation can reduce the number of promising and talented young people in national teams.

Many athletes and coaches of conscription age have joined the Armed Forces of Ukraine, the National Guard and the Territorial Defence Forces and today are out of the education and training processes.

61 athletes and coaches have died or have been killed in hostilities on the territory of Ukraine, 7 people are taken prisoner (indicative data).

More than 300 planned all-Ukrainian competitions and 8 international competitions on the territory of Ukraine have been cancelled and not held.

The number of training camps and international competitions in which athletes of national teams has taken part has decreased by more than a third, namely:

in Olympic sports, 45 national training camps were conducted in Ukraine and 150 - abroad out of 440 planned; Ukrainian athletes participated in 116 international competitions out of 367 planned;

in non-Olympic sports, 15 national training camps were held in Ukraine and 38 – abroad out of 231 planned; Ukrainian athletes took part in 52 international competitions;

in sports for people with disabilities, 81 national training camps were conducted in Ukraine and 51 - abroad out of 362 planned; Ukrainian athletes participated in 18 international competitions out of 67 planned.

According to the preliminary information, 70% of physical culture and sports institutions work full-time, and 25% - have temporarily suspended their activities. 44 institutions have been partially damaged, 14 – have been completely destroyed.

Only 35% of athletes continue their training on premises of children's and youth sports institutions and institutions for reserve sports (162 thousand people), almost 44 thousand – continue their training outside the institutions, 28 thousand athletes train abroad. More than 120,000 athletes are unable to play their sport and do not have the opportunity to train.

50% of coaches and teachers go on working in children's and youth sports institutions and institutions for reserve sports (6 thousand people out of 11.8): 4.3 thousand coaches are working full-time, 221 of them are abroad; 3.5 thousand coaches and teachers are working remotely, 292 of them are abroad; there are four thousand coaches and teachers who are not working, 479 of them are abroad.

The condition of 55% of sports facilities of children's and youth sports institutions and institutions for reserve sports is satisfactory (1450 facilities out of 2532), 6 facilities have been completely destroyed, 22 - have been partially damaged.

According to the program of the President of Ukraine "25 sports facilities-magnets", four facilities were built and put into operation in 2021 (with funds managed by the Ministry of Youth and Sports), one of them was destroyed (Mariupol), one - is located in the occupied territory (Melitopol). By the end of 2022, sports palaces, sports complexes and swimming pools were to be built in seven cities of Ukraine, such as Rivne, Uman, Khmelnytskyi, Kryvyi Rih, Trostyanets, Nova Kakhovka, Ternopil.

One of the essential issues in the development of high-achievement sports is the availability and continuous development of modern institutions of physical culture and sports with the status of the base for Olympic, Paralympic and Deaflympic training. At the beginning of the military aggression of the Russian Federation, there were more than 70 institutions in Ukraine with the corresponding status (including such bases in the occupied territories). Under martial law, due to the allocation of funds to the needs of the state, there is a challenge of maintaining, gradually reconstructing and developing the bases for Olympic, Paralympic and Deaflympic training, as a prerequisite for the development of high-achievement sports.

After the war in Ukraine, the number of people with disabilities, including children, will increase, so it is necessary to set all the conditions for their speedy recovery and adaptation to a full life in society.

Pertaining to the implementation of programme documents: the implementation of key programme documents has been suspended - the State Targeted Social Program "Youth of Ukraine" for 2021-2025, the State Targeted Social Program of National and Patriotic Education until 2025, the State Targeted Social Program for the Development of Physical Culture and Sports until 2024, the implementation of the Action Plan for 2021-2022 on the implementation of the first stage of the Strategy of Development of Physical Culture and Sports of Ukraine until 2028, the fulfilment of tasks defined by the Regulations on the social project "Active parks - locations of healthy Ukraine" has been partially suspended.

Key challenges in the following areas: (youth policy, physical culture and sports, national and patriotic education):

- creating a safe environment for living, working and realising the potential of young people in Ukraine;
- ensuring the mental stability and reducing the level of anxiety among young people;
- increasing the level of independence, resilience and ability of young people to participate in public life;
- meeting basic needs of young people, in particular those who have become internally displaced persons and those who have been forced to stay abroad;
- reconstructing destroyed or damaged youth centres and spaces, as well as restoring their activities in order to ensure their provision of relevant services and

implementation of programs for reintegration, socialisation and adaptation and development of youth under the war and in the post-war period;

- resuming work of specialists engaged in work with young people and training new ones, including youth workers (68% of whom are not working with young people now because they have been forced to leave their place of residence and move to safer places);

- limited possibilities of conducting organised physical education classes, physical culture and sports rehabilitation activities, lack of accessible modern sports and health infrastructure to all segments of the population and motivation of the population to engage in diverse physical activities;

- suspension of the implementation of the all-Ukrainian social project to involve the population in physical activities "Active parks - locations of healthy Ukraine";

- lost opportunities for children and youth to engage in selected physical activities on the premises of children's and youth sports institutions and institutions for reserve sports and in places of forced migration; unbalanced or suspended operations of physical education institutions;

- different level of financial and logistical support of the sports sphere in different regions and communities, which is not provided uniformly by the state depending on quantitative and qualitative indicators, but depends on the capacity of local budgets and the mood of local leaders and deputies;

- forced migration of coaches and teachers of physical education institutions, in particular abroad, and their temporary employment under better conditions;

- disrupted education and training processes of athletes of national teams, the impossibility of holding all-Ukrainian competitions as the main component of the selection procedure for the participation in international competitions, termination of competitions on the territory of Ukraine;

- lack of a clear position in legislation and regulations on the priority of physical culture and health activities and Olympic and Paralympic sports;

- the international sports community statements on the sports` being beyond politics complicates the process of encouraging international sports organisations to ban the Russian Federation and the Republic of Belarus from the world sports events;

- suspended testing of athletes in Ukraine for doping, reduction of institutional capacity and outflow of employees of the national anti-doping system;

- destroyed or damaged sports infrastructure and technical facilities of physical education institutions in locations with intense hostilities, loss of sports equipment and inventory;

- increased costs of projects for the reconstruction, construction and major maintenance of sports facilities due to the termination of work;

- work with the population of the temporarily occupied territories, especially with the citizens who have been under occupation for 8 years, their integration into Ukrainian society.

Key opportunities:

- young people who have been forced to stay abroad have gained experience of living in the EU countries and can apply it in Ukraine;
- the possibility of establishing modern youth centres and spaces that will provide relevant and quality services in accordance with the needs of young people through using innovative technologies and without being tied to outdated buildings;
- new opportunities for young people related to Ukraine's full membership in European youth programs;
- the opportunity to comprehend the potential of young people and their role in hastening the victory day, recovery and development of the country as a whole (including at the local level);
- involvement of institutions, organisations, physical education institutions, private sector and volunteers in arranging and conducting accessible physical activities and rehabilitation in all the regions of Ukraine;
- recovering sports facilities situated in areas of public recreation and at the place of residence, parks, squares for physical activities, including regional sports locations of the social project "Active parks - locations of healthy Ukraine";
- ensuring the priority of physical culture and health activities, Olympic and Paralympic sports;
- introduction of a fair system of state support in the sports sphere - financing of physical culture and sports institutions (regardless of the form of ownership) depending on quantitative and qualitative indicators in priority areas for the state;
- development of new forms of organisation of physical activities offline and online for different population groups, school leagues, challenges, online sports trainings;
- restoration of full-fledged and effective work of existing ones and assistance in opening new institutions of physical culture and sports, providing them with high-quality and accessible for all segments of the population services for selected sports;
- resuming educational and training processes of athletes of national teams, holding all-Ukrainian and international sports events in Ukraine;
- adaptation of the Ukrainian legislation on the anti-doping control to the international and European laws; recovering activities of the National Anti-Doping Centre under the war and reinstating the doping test program for athletes; establishment of the National Anti-Doping Laboratory as an independent organisation in the sports anti-doping system of Ukraine;
- optimised youth policy and sports management with the use of digital tools, creation of a mechanism for effective interaction between service providers and users;
- modernization of sports facilities, including Olympic, Paralympic and Deaflympic training bases; involvement of the European experts into their activities;
- promotion of national consciousness in society, formation of patriotism based on spirituality and morality, popularisation of the Ukrainian cultural heritage, social activity and responsibility for entrusted state and public affairs, readiness to perform

the duty to protect Ukraine's independence and territorial integrity, promotion of European values.

Key limitations:

- high rates of both internal and external migration of young people (according to the IOM survey dated 23.05.2022, there are 7,134,000 internally displaced persons in Ukraine, 35% of whom are young people);
- insufficient number of specialists that the state will need to rebuild Ukraine;
- scarce resources to provide assistance and support to young people, including those who are on the occupied territories of Ukraine and those who are forced to stay abroad;
- limited number of professionals engaged in work with young people, including youth workers;
- limited number of youth centres and spaces that provide services to young people, and the need of their reorientation to today's challenges;
- insufficient number of available mechanisms for youth participation in public life, including decision-making processes at the local level;
- Insufficient funding and current restrictions on the recovery of physical education institutions, organisation and conducting of physical and sports activities and rehabilitation, anti-doping control activities due to the martial law in Ukraine;
- lack of a system for providing financial and logistical support to institutions of physical culture and sports of various forms of ownership - depending on quantitative and qualitative indicators in the priority areas of activity;
- Athletes and parents are offered long-term lucrative employment contracts in places of forced migration which hinder their return to Ukraine;
- Lack of proper logistics and security conditions for the modernization and development of sports infrastructure, collection and transportation of doping samples by doping officers to WADA-accredited laboratories;
- insufficient human and financial resources; weak interdepartmental cooperation in the field of national and patriotic education.
