Current objectives of ITA monitoring

- To improve information sharing and aid coordination & effectiveness
- To understand the full picture of ITA to the health sector, including the distribution of funds by type, geographical coverage, health system functions, health service development, disease areas etc.
- To identify the overlapping of funds by health system functions.
- To identify unoccupied niches for future ITA projects.
- To increase transparency of ITA.
- To coordinate strategic planning processes and actual priorities of the MOH with international partners.

Problem: Insufficient quality and lack of information within half-year monitoring forms (sent by recipients of the ITA projects).

ITA monitoring tool*

The core idea of the tool is to conduct a survey among developing partners on the current ITA projects and, as a result, to make a complex analysis of the received data and to deliver a report (with further publication on the MOH official website).

Key elements of the survey:

- general information about the international partners and their projects;
- financial allocation by type of funding, health system areas, health system categories, diseases areas and geographical coverage;
- key achievements;
- alignment of aid with national policies and strategies, etc.

Next steps

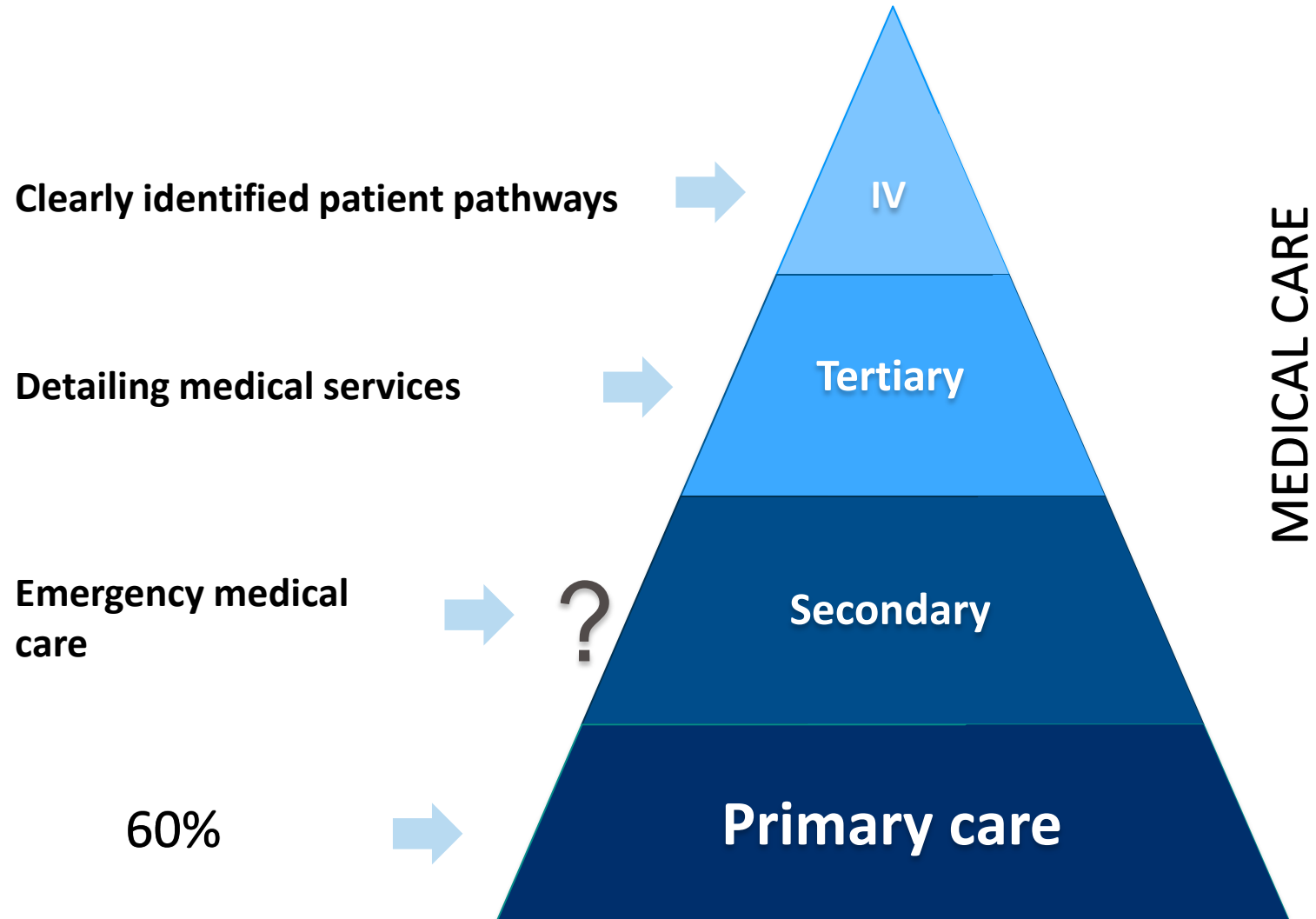
- The questionnaire to collect information on each development partner will be developed and distributed to agencies, funds and other donors.

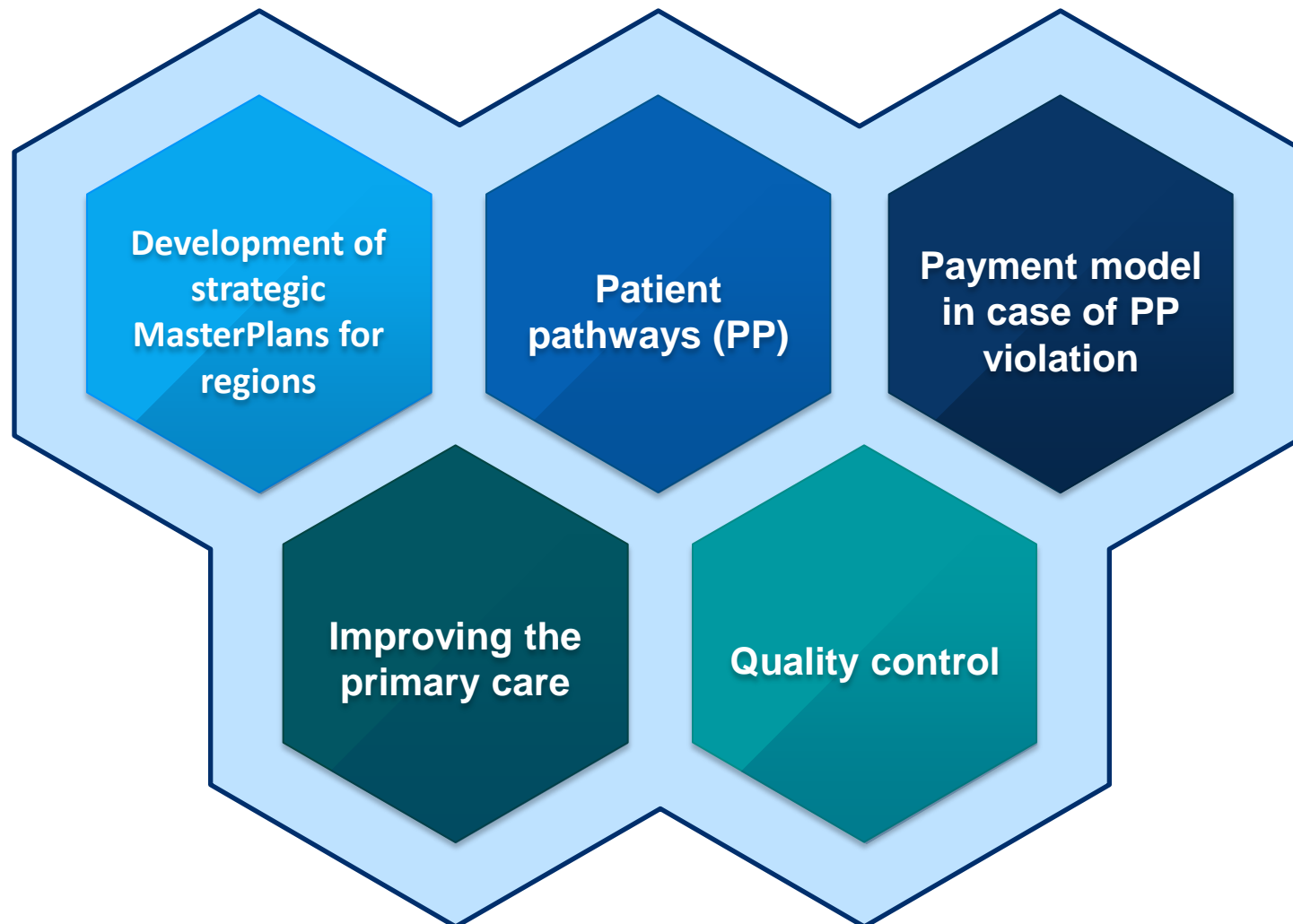

Emergency medical care **2018-2021**

Transformation of EMC system 2018:

- The start of creation of the information-analytical system "Central103";
- Introduction of new professions and qualification requirements for them (emergency medical technician, paramedic, doctor of emergency medicine);
- First 50 students in medical universities majored in paramedics (bachelor).

Transformation of EMC system 2019:

- EMC pilot project:
 - 15 Dispatch Centers were created (currently DC are already operating in 23 regions, which are connected to "Central103", by the end of 2020 - all 25)
 - 6 regions are equipped with 100% new cars
 - 6 regions are equipped with equipment for educational and training departments of the EMC center
 - Transit courses for paramedics and doctors have been launched in 6 regions according to the new standards.
- The concept of emergency medical care
- New clinical protocol "Emergency care: pre-hospital stage"
- A new brigade with a transition period until 2025 has been approved

Transformation of EMC system 2020:

- Action plan for the implementation of the EMC Development Concept
- Clinical routes of the patient (pre-hospital stage)
- New report card for EMC system equipment
- Table of equipment of EMC departments in BLIL
- Emergency medical care from April 1 is available at SGP:
116 UAH / person / year (until June 30)
164 UAH / person / year (from July 1) + 40%
- EMC standard for patients with suspected COVID-19
- Additional MGP package: Emergency medical care for patients with COVID-19
- Completion of the DC (Kyiv, Luhansk region)
- Completion of procurement of equipment for TC in 19 regions
- Completion of the purchase of 20% of cars in 19 regions

Transformation of EMC system 2021:

- Training, retraining and advanced training of EMC employees (drivers, medical workers of brigades, DC dispatchers) with introduction of external quality control of knowledge
- Development of clinical protocols, standard operating procedures and clinical routes of the patient for EMC departments in ICH
- Creation and implementation of dispatching protocols
- In MGP, the introduction of coefficients for priority states
